Bernie Wiehle

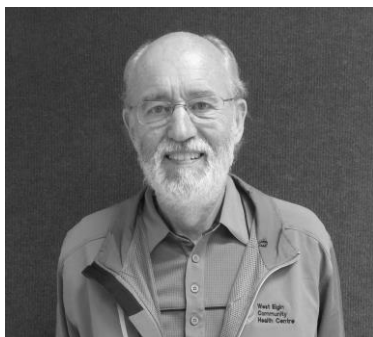
Bernie Wiehle is currently a self-employed Beekeeper and is also Vice President of the Ontario Beekeepers Association.

Bernie joined the West Elgin Community Health Centre's Board in September 2020.

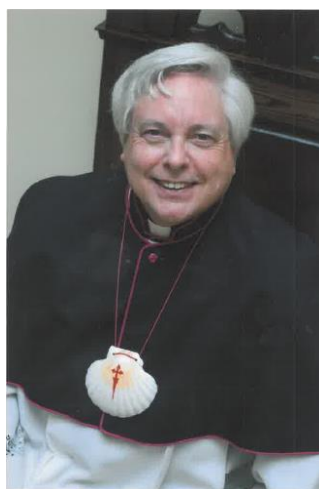


David James – Board Chair
