Nurse Practitioner Paediatric Outreach Program

18 Month Contract Employment (30 hours a week)

The Centre's Paediatric Outreach Program, funding by Ontario Health West, is a new community-based service intended to meet the care needs of unattached paediatric clients between the ages 0-5 across Elgin County and beyond. The goal is to increase access to preventative and health promotion care and services, specifically for infants and children without access to primary care, including equity-seeking populations living in rural communities, children with material deprivation and those with low-income, socio-economic risk factors. Paediatric clients are not rostered to the CHC.

Role Overview:

- Lead and shape the development, monitoring, evaluation of the outreach program including screening of unattached infants and children 0-5 for physical, cognitive, language, social-emotional, developmental, nutritional behavioural milestones
- Work closely and extensively with community partner organizations to develop a robust and integrated service - identifying and addressing gaps across communities
- Use specialized knowledge/skills to provide safe, competent nursing care to the 0-5 paediatric population

What Do you Bring to the Position?

- Current Registered Nurse, Extended Class (RN-EC) in good standing with the College of Nurses of Ontario
- Demonstrated program development experience *preferred* and experience with ages 0-5 an *asset*
- Excellent communicator, critical thinker, promotes evidence based nursing practice through research and utilizes principles of health education, adult learning, and the teaching learning process to meet health promotion needs
- Embraces the CHC model of care and unwavering in your beliefs about the social determinants of health
- Demonstrated ability to work independently and collaboratively within an interprofessional team
