A Systems Navigator assists people in navigating the health, community and social service systems while providing psychosocial support through the process. This temporary, part-time position will focus on vulnerable clients in our community with an emphasis given to adults with disabilities, mental illness and those living in poverty or homelessness. This position is funded through the United Way program "Reaching Home Grant for Rural Communities".

PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Actively involved in the short-term and long-term planning to prevent homelessness.
- Engage with people who are homeless or at risk of homelessness and develop a strategy to provide a variety of supports to help individuals stabilize their lives.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Experience working with marginalized people and with homeless individuals with complex needs. Experience working with vulnerable populations.
- Mental health training an asset.
- Must be a reliable, self-starter committed to connecting people to supports and services.
- Must be confident to work alone and as part of a team.
- Undergraduate degree from a recognized university in a relevant discipline and significant related experience in a community setting.
- Flexibility to work evenings/weekends according to program needs.
Note: there is a potential for increase in hours contingent on funding.
